



Special Events to Highlight Your Public Safety Services

The Lebanon Police and Fire Departments are sponsoring upcoming events for the community to highlight the public safety services provided to Lebanon residents.



Lebanon Police Department will host “National Night Out” on August 6 from 7-9 p.m. in front of the Police Station on Silver Street. The road will be blocked on Silver Street, from Broadway to Sycamore Street, and many services and activities will be provided. The SWAT unit will be on display, along with K-9 Kaiser, crime prevention tips, child ID kits, entertainment, including music and an inflatable bounce house, refreshments and more.

National Night Out is an annual event designed to strengthen communities by encouraging neighborhoods to engage in stronger relationships with each other and with local law enforcement partners to heighten crime-prevention awareness, build support and participation in local anti-crime programs. Lebanon Fire Department will host its Open House on October 9 from 6-8 p.m. at Station 41, 20 W. Silver Street. The event is held in conjunction with National Fire Prevention Week. This year’s theme is “Prevent Kitchen Fires.” More fires start in the kitchen than any other part of the home, and Lebanon Fire Department can provide tips to prevent these fires from beginning in the first place.

The Fire Department will also have fire unit displays, refreshments and information regarding the upcoming Fire Levy. The community is encouraged to learn more about the City’s Fire and EMS operations and how the Fire Department is working to keep pace with community needs.

Since the passage of the current levy five years ago, the Lebanon Fire Department has experienced revenue losses caused by reductions in Medicare reimbursements and property devaluations. The new 7.0 levy will offset a \$290,000 annual loss in property tax revenue and ensure current service levels are maintained.
