




City Identifies Key Roadway Projects for 2014

The City has several key roadway improvement projects underway in 2014, in addition to the annual resurfacing and concrete replacement program.

The State Route 123 / State Route 63 connector project is underway and will be completed this summer. The connector provides a new 4,000 ft. roadway, which will connect West Main Street at Glosser Road with S.R. 123 at Hart Road. The connector was designed to move north - south traffic on the west side of downtown more effectively, and will include signalized intersections at both Glosser Road and Hart Road. The City was awarded a \$3.1 million grant to help support this project.

The City also received a \$670,000 State grant to partially fund the

reconstruction of East Street, between Park Avenue and Deerfield Road this summer. This section of roadway is in poor condition, with a severe pavement cross slope and an inadequate storm sewer system. This affected portion of roadway will be closed during reconstruction.

The reconstruction of West Street, from Main Street to Silver Street, will begin in July. This project will include the replacement of deteriorating pavement, and

the installation of new curb and gutter. The project is scheduled to be completed by Fall, and is partially funded by a \$300,000 State grant. West Street will be closed, from Main Street to Silver Street, during the construction phase of the project.

Despite Lebanon's aggressive use of State and Federal grants, our City's

road maintenance program remains underfunded by \$1.5 million annually. This significant funding shortfall results in a growing backlog of road resurfacing projects and increasingly poor driving conditions.
